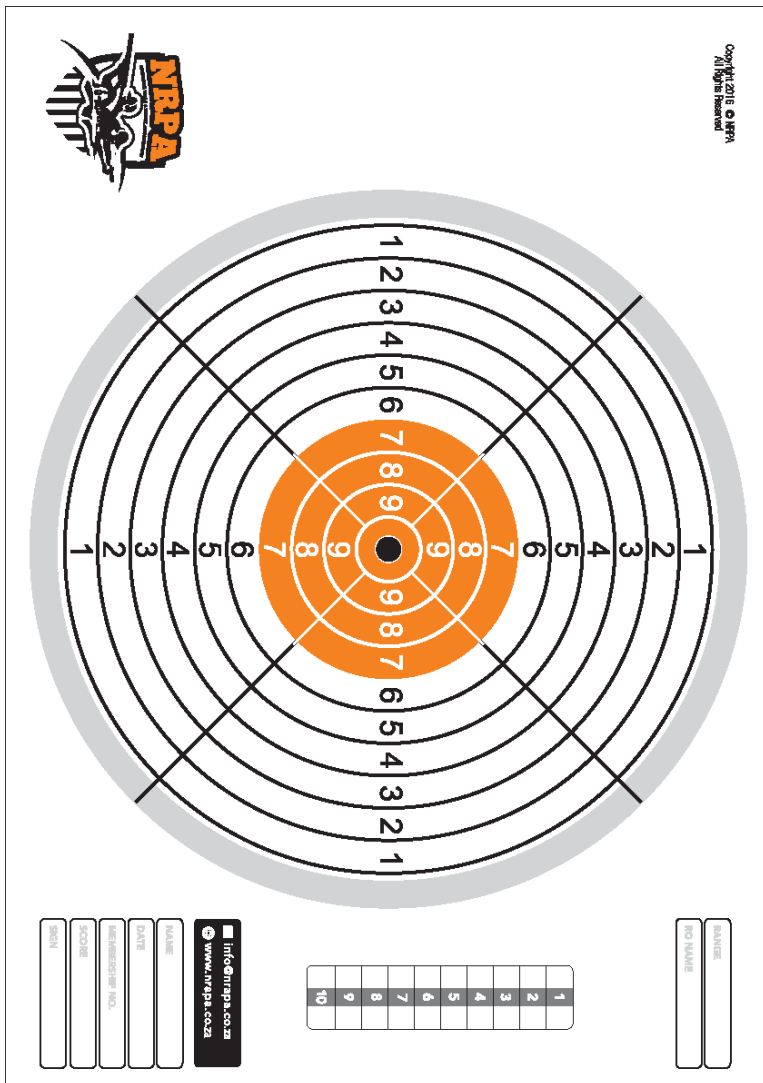


1. Dedicated Sport Practical Test – Dedicated 100m Target – Target size (A4)



Target: Dedicated Rifle Target

Rifle: Any caliber bolt action rifles

Course of Fire

This event is shot at 100 meters. A total of 5 shots excluding your sighters are allowed. It takes approximately 5 minutes to complete and it requires 5 rounds.

Position

All shooting will be done in a sitting position from either a chair or a stool with the gun being supported on a two point rests. A bipod and or attached rifle rest is permitted while shooting. Shooting Ranges, Specific -100 Meters

Ready Position: Rifle facing the target, bolt open and may only be loaded and closed when ready to fire.

Sights: Sights include any type of iron sight, a red dot, or any magnification scope.

Eye & Ear Protection – The wearing of eye and ear protection is required at all times.

Classifications

The classification score bands are as follows:

X Class 45-50

A Class 40-44

B Class 20-39

C Class up 19

Scoring: Target is scored at the end of the shoot only. Targets are to be scored in the usual manner: i.e. a hit that touches a scoring ring shall be given the higher value if a gauge of the same caliber as that used to fire on the target, touches some part of the ring when the gauge is inserted in the bullet hole, or an overlay scoring slide of the same caliber as that used to fire on the target touches some part of the scoring ring when the slide is laid on the target.

The course of fire must be completed on an official shooting range, signed off by a Range Officer or any responsible person employed to manage the range or fellow NRPA shooter. The completed activities scorecard must be e-mail, faxed or delivered by hand to the NRPA' Head Office. The scorecard can be down loaded from our website. It is the shooters responsibility keep record of all targets.
